Thoughts from the Director

In a world where power and notoriety is revered and respected and where celebrities, political and business leaders make the daily headlines, **the stories involving the smallest and least important human beings can be forgotten about and lost.** However, two little people were recently recognized and remembered, 11-month old Charlie Gard and newborn Baby Chloe.

In case you haven't heard either of their stories, Charlie was a beautiful, strong willed, tiny warrior who hung on to life and was loved by his parents and obviously by folks all over the world. Nevertheless, the medical authorities of the Great Osmond Street Hospital in England and the courts in that country had decided that this baby had "no quality of life and no prospect of quality of life" and so his life was allowed to be ended. Charlie had a severe life-threatening medical condition. Rallying to his support was the international community including Pope Francis and President Donald Trump. In addition, the Columbia University Medical Center was convinced to admit Charlie and the U.S. Congress offered his parents permanent resident status so that they could bring him here for treatment. His story tugged on the heartstrings of millions around the world who contributed more than two million dollars for his care. Regardless of all of this, Charlie died and was mourned for by not only his parents, but also by people all over the globe.

Then, there was Baby Chloe who was found abandoned and left in a dumpster in an apartment complex outside of Houston. After she was discovered, Chloe was taken to the Texas Children's Hospital, where doctors concluded that she was just a few days old. Her beautiful face was shown on the television screen where she melted the hearts of the people of Texas. Groups of strangers began emailing and calling to find out more about the process of adopting her. MyFoxHouston wrote, "Individuals interested in adopting her should 'get in line.'" Chloe's story is said to be a baby "who went from a dumpster to being the most sought-after girl in Texas." **Doesn't this story shatter the myth that abortion is the best choice for a so-called "unwanted child?"**

The point of these stories is that there are still many of us who follow Jesus' teaching on "Whatever you've done for the least of these...you've done it for Me." And according to these stories, there are not just a few of these followers who believe this, but millions who love life and respect the lives of these tiny, so called forgotten ones. The interest and overwhelming support for these two babies (one sickly and the other discarded) gives me hope for our society and could mean a turnaround for this supposed "culture of death." These stories encourage me to keep doing what I'm doing and remind me that this is why, "we do what we do!"



Medical Corner

The Rest of the Story

As I write, I think of two women who came recently, but on separate days, to our Mobile Unit for pregnancy tests and ultrasounds. Both were beautiful women in their late 30's, both had done home pregnancy tests which were positive and both were contemplating abortion.



In our client sessions we hear many reasons to justify an abortion. "It's not the right time." "I want to be married before I have kids." "I have too many kids already!" "I'm not financially ready for a child." "I'm too young." "I'm not sure who the father is." "I don't want another girl (or boy). I'll get an abortion if the gender is 'wrong'." "My parents are very religious. They will kick me out if I'm pregnant!"

Often the reasons for abortion revolve around the need for emotional support or financial resources. As we gather information about community resources, we are gathering support for our clients. Every time we can tell a woman about a food pantry or free service for new moms, we are providing support and helping her see that she can keep this baby. Our church and volunteer community help us in amazing ways to support our clients. Many bring gently used baby items. Some bring food pantry donations. Others bring handmade baby quilts and afghans. A gift card, baby blanket, or hug express love and support to a woman or young girl who may be very scared, and who may need this token to move her to accept life for her baby. Our actions say, "You CAN parent and we will help!" Every time we introduce our client to Jesus, give her a Bible, and share the plan of salvation, we encourage her to consider and embrace eternal life.

Now back to my two clients considering abortion. When it came time to make a decision, one chose life for her baby, and the other chose abortion. Both heard the same message. Both received our free services, information, and care. Both made decisions that will have a life-long impact.

Even when circumstances look similar, there are no guarantees that outside influences might be sending a louder message than the one we promote for life. Please keep praying for our work and for the women who come to us believing the lie that abortion is their "only" option.

Upon returning to the clinic for her test results, she said that she thought about the conversation we had during the last visit about abstinence. She even discussed it with her mother, who agreed that her daughter should wait until marriage to have sex. So, thank God, this client not only made the decision to commit her life to Christ but also committed to the abstinence lifestyle!



Dr. G., as we would call him, was a volunteer physician who read our ultrasound scans faithfully until his death on April 19, 2017. Dr. Harold Gianopulos was a Radiologist who retired from his position at Northwest Community Hospital in Arlington Heights (1970-2002). He was Board certified in Radiology Nuclear Medicine and Nuclear Radiology. After retiring, he generously volunteered his time at 3 not-for-profit clinics in the Chicagoland area, including TLC/Life Choices. Dr. G. also served as a Board Member for TLC Pregnancy Services.

This man of faith was always kind, gracious, a very generous supporter and was a blessing to all of us at TLC/Life Choices Medical. I remember Ruth Feldman, our R.D.M.S. and our Medical Coordinator, who had known Dr. G. as a volunteer professional long before we did, remark, "I rate Dr. G. as being a '10' on the scale of 'sweetness'!"

Yes, this special volunteer doctor is truly missed by all of us here. Let's not forget to continue in prayer for his wife Mary and for their family as they deal with their loss. WHAT'S HAPPENING

I recently went on a mission trip to Haiti. What an experience! Life changing! While I was there I was able to do ultrasounds with an ultrasound machine that was donated by TLC. (It was outdated and we needed a more modern system.) TLC gave the machine to IFFO (International Foundation for Orphans) to send to Haiti. How excited I was when I started the machine for the first time and found it was running perfectly.

The women receiving the ultrasounds came down from the mountains. They traveled in a pickup truck in the rain for 45 minutes just to get there! They had never had an ultrasound before. This was the first time they got to see their babies. This is a little different from what we experience here in the states, where a mother may travel in the comfort of her own car, or perhaps using public transportation, to her appointment where she may have an ultrasound once, or even several times, over the course of her pregnancy. Here in this part of Haiti, this was a novelty!

I also showed Dr. Markenly how to work the ultrasound machine. He is planning on running a free clinic there in Haiti. There is very little in the way of healthcare there. I personally know a gentleman who lost his wife during childbirth. Had she had proper healthcare, she probably would still be alive. The machine not only can help pregnant women, it can also scan all other organs except for the heart. What a great tool this will be to Dr. Markenly and the people of Haiti!

Dr. Markenly has seen his first client; she was abortion minded. After she tested positive for pregnancy, he was able to show her the fetal models TLC gave him. He then explained the fetal growth and development and offered her an ultrasound. She changed her mind and is keeping the baby! Dr. Markenly was so excited! Contributing to this happy story, he even got to present the Gospel!
